Season Outlook: The Profs ended the 2010-2011 season ranked 12th in the Southeast Division with a 14-12-3-1 overall record. The Profs had a decent season with a solid schedule in which the team had its ups and downs. The team finished the season well going 7-2-1-0 in the second semester but had weak middle of the season performances that kept them out of the top ten. Even with the teams' struggles, the Profs finished the season tied for fourth in the Mid-Atlantic standings and making the playoffs. The Profs knocked rival Rider from continuing on with a big 6-1 win in the opening round. The momentum fell short however as the Profs fell to the UMBC Retrievers in the semi-finals.

Key moments during the season included the Profs hosting their second ACHA outdoor game in the falling snow; two wins over national contender Temple; and a great playoff run that fell just short.

Entering the 2011-12 season, Rowan returns their full roster but five. Despite losing their captain, the Profs roster remains solid with returning players like last season's point leader Colin Davis, forward Jonathan Paulo, and defensemen Erich Moen and captain Rob DeSimone.

"We had our ups and downs last year with consistency being our number one problem. Hopefully we can fix that this year," head coach John Caulfield said. "We have a good amount of returning players coming back so I am not worried too much. Our goal is to go deeper in the playoffs and make a bigger impact overall. We have a decent group coming in, so I am very excited."

"This is a new year and a lot more is expected from us," associate head coach Mike Husek said. "We had some very key players leave last year but we have a large recruiting class coming in that should help. Some of these guys we went after played at a very high level. It should be a great season."

The Profs have 43 committed players coming in and both teams should see some solid upgrades. The position between the pipes is still open as junior Brien Bennett is coming back from an off-season surgery. Also returning are Jim Wright and Dan Kelchner.

Over the last few seasons, the Profs have made strides in becoming one of the most prestigious programs in the region and this season looks to be no different. The Profs appear to be well prepared after some hard work in the off-season. With some good additions, they should be in position to make another run for the league championship.
